Yes and that \$1.6 million is the target for future years. \$1.6 million represents the operating needs of the programs Sarah Barder supports. So in future years, if the spending policy (5.5%) calculation produces a grant budget in excess of \$1.6 million, the budget will be capped \$1.6 million with the excess separately tracked and retained in the SDB fund. If actual SDB portfolio performance for the year results in income less than \$1.6 million on the fund the Foundation will make grants to the extent of the income earned. The unspent portion of the \$1.6 million SDB budget cannot be spent on unrestricted grants since SDB funds are restricted to certain programs. In other words, the unspent portion also cannot be spent by Dan.

The grant from the SDB portfolio was calculated using the quarterly average for the number of quarters the portfolio existed. As of 9/30/10 the quarterly average assets were \$30,530,180. 5.5% of that is \$1,679,160. It was rounded to \$1,600,000 for the budget.

The regular grant budget is \$31,640,000. It is the total grant budget less \$1,600,000.
