This is to nominate Stephen Moore for a Bradley Prize for 2015.

Mr. Moore is currently the senior economist at The Heritage Foundation in Washington, D.C. Before that he served for several years as opinion and editorial writer for *The Wall Street Journal*. Prior to that time he was president of the Club for Growth.

He holds a B.A. from the University of Illinois where he came under the influence of and became friends with the late Julian Simon. He also earned a Master's Degree in economics from George Mason University.

Mr. Moore is known as a tireless advocate – evangelist – for free market tax and regulatory policies, a point of view that he has developed in hundreds of articles and editorials, several books, and countless lectures to campus and business organizations. He has also served as an advisor to various grass roots organizations, such as the American Legislative Exchange Council and the State Policy Network. He has advised governors and members of Congress on tax policy (most recently the governor of Kansas). He is a grant advisor for the Searle Freedom Trust. Mr. Moore has tried, and succeeded in many cases, to translate free market ideas into public policy. Therein one finds his broad influence on the politics and intellectual debates of our present era.

He is most recently the author of: Who's the Fairest of Them All? The Truth about Opportunity, Taxes, and Wealth in America (Encounter Books, 2013); An Inquiry into the Nature and Causes of the Wealth of States: How Taxes, Energy, and Worker Freedom Change Everything (Wiley, 2014, with Arthur Laffer); and Return to Prosperity: How America Can Regain Its Economic Superpower Status (Threshold Books; 2011.) Mr. Moore's articles on tax policy regularly appear in leading venues such as The Wall Street Journal and The Washington Post.
