Bradley Foundation Proposed Nominations: W. Cole Durham Jr.



W. Cole Durham Jr.
Director, International Center for Law and Religion Studies
Brigham Young University

Professor W. Cole Durham is the director of the BYU International Center for Law and Religion Studies ("Center") and the president of the International Consortium for Law and Religion Studies. He has extensive experience in comparative law scholarship, with an emphasis on comparative constitutional law.

Professor Durham has testified before the U.S. Congress in hearings on religious intolerance in Europe and on the Religious Liberty Protection Act. Under his direction, the Center has submitted amicus briefs for recent U.S. Supreme Court decisions involving religious liberty, such as *Hosanna-Tabor* and *Hobby Lobby*. He also has organized a series of conferences on comparative law issues at Brigham Young University and at other institutions in the United States which have brought more than 1000 scholars and experts dealing with comparative constitutional law themes from more than 140 countries to the United States.

He has expanded these conferences from the U.S. to the Pacific, Asia, Europe, Eastern Europe, Africa, and Latin America. His casebook *Law and Religion: National, International, and Comparative Perspectives* has been translated for training sessions in Vietnam and China. He is a cofounder of the Oxford Journal of Law and Religion.

He has been involved in constitutional and statutory drafting projects in approximately 50 countries. In 2010, he testified via teleconference before the Indonesia Constitutional Court concerning the constitutionality of the Indonesian blasphemy law. He has authored numerous law review articles dealing with religious liberty and other comparative law themes (see curriculum vitae attached to email).
