Wendy Lee Gramm

Called "the Margaret Thatcher of financial regulation" by the Wall Street Journal (Nov. 12, 1999 editorial), and "My favorite economist," by President Ronald Reagan, Dr. Wendy Lee Gramm holds a B.A. degree from Wellesley College (1966) and a Ph. D. (1971) from Northwestern University, both in Economics. She has an extensive publication record including articles in the *American Economic Review*, *The Review of Economics and Statistics* and the *Journal of Law and Economics*. Dr. Gramm founded the Regulatory Studies Program at the *Mercatus Center* at George Mason University where she is an emeritus Distinguished Senior Scholar. She was a founder of and is currently Chairman of the Board of the *Texas Public Policy Foundation*, a major public policy think tank.

Dr. Gramm served as Chairman of the U.S. Commodity Futures Trading Commission from 1988-1993. She was Administrator for Information and Regulatory Affairs at the Office of Management and Budget from 1985 to 1988 where she was referred to as the "regulation Tsar" as she throttled old regulations and made new the establishment of new ones difficult. Wendy has also served as the Executive Director of the Presidential Task Force on Regulatory Relief, and Director of the Federal Trade Commission's Bureau of Economics. She started her economics career at Texas A&M University, where she taught in the Department of Economics for over eight years. She holds a B.A. from Wellesley College and a Ph.D. from Northwestern University, both in Economics.

Dr. Gramm has played an important role in slowing the expansion of federal agency rule-making and reducing the regulatory impediments to financial transactions. She is Chairman of the Board of the conservative think tank, the *Texas Public Policy Foundation*, TPPF. Dr. Gramm has been on the Texas A&M University Board of Regents and is a board member of the *Independent Women's Forum*, the *International Republican Institute*, and the Texas A&M University *Private Enterprise Research Center*. Wendy and her husband, former Senator W. Philip Gramm maintain their primary residence near Helotes Texas.
