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MISSION AND PROGRAMS

Mission

HDI helps free populations of debilitating diseases which are deemed to be eradicable as public health problems, but insufficiently addressed at the time HDI becomes engaged.

Programs

1. Obstetric Fistula, and Maternal and Newborn Mortality Prevention; 2. Guinea Worm Disease Eradication; 3) Global Lymphatic Filariasis (LF; "elephantiasis") Elimination

Additional Comments from the Organization

HDI launched the world's first ever community-based rapid obstetric fistula prevention program in December 2007. For the first time all but 2 HDI-assisted countries had ZERO cases of guinea worm disease, and Niger had only 11. And the Gates Foundation/World Bank supported evaluation showed largely excellent outcomes of surgeries conducted after training of district surgeons under the West African LF Morbidity Project.

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GOALS AND RESULTS

Accomplishments for Fiscal Year Ending December 31, 2007

1. Launched the world's first ever pilot community-based program to rapidly prevent obstetric fistula and maternal deaths from obstructed labor, in Bankilare, Niger.
2. All HDI-assisted countries except 2 now report ZERO cases of guinea worm disease (dracunculiasis), and Niger had only 11 cases! (as of December 31, 2007)
3. The West African LF Morbidity Program had what we consider a very positive World Bank / Gates Foundation assisted evaluation, as it trains ever more teachers of surgery and district surgeons in modern LF-surgery methods, benefitting thousands of patients in more countries than ever.

Objectives for Fiscal Year Beginning January 1, 2008

1. Demonstrate initial hard-data-outcomes success in the prevention of obstetric fistula. Goal: At least 75% reduction in women dying from obstructed labor and at least 50% fewer new fistula cases by the end of Year 2 (2009).
2. See Niger interrupt guinea worm disease transmission, leaving only four countries in the world with guinea worm, and see that no imported cases from Ghana and Sudan go undetected in neighboring HDI-assisted countries.
3. Bring the total up to 12 West African countries that have district surgeons trained in modern LF-surgery. Assist more men in Burkina Faso and Togo to receive good-quality surgery so they can get back to work supporting themselves and their families and improve the dignity of their existence, by effectively using 2 existing grants.



Self Assessment


Monthly village-based data collection, analyzed externally, e.g. by Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) in guinea worm eradication, and external evaluation, e.g. of LF-surgery outcomes, provide hard-outcomes data used to judge HDI's program effectiveness.

Using a budget of less than \$500,000 per year, HDI has a 17-year track record of results that have benefitted millions in Africa and Asia as a result of HDI catalytic approach. Support by the Conrad N. Hilton Foundation, The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation through the World Bank, The Pro Victimis Foundation, and others have been used to achieve what HDI considers to be considerable success in spite of its small size, through 17 years (as of Sep. 2007). Administrative expenses are considered low due to the high proportion of work done on a volunteer, pro bono basis.

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
