Programs

LFA advocates for increased federal appropriations for research on lupus, and continues to provide direct financial support to young scientists seeking to find the causes and cure for lupus through its privately-supported research grant programs. LFA promotes and provides education and training for physicians and other health professionals by conducting Continuing Medical Education (CME) programs, and Continuing Education (CE) program for nurses and other health professionals. LFA reports distributing lupus information at more than 1,800 health fairs, conducting educational programs/workshops/seminars for 12,000 people with lupus and their families, providing lupus information to more than 57,000 inquirers. The organization also publishes a national magazine, "Lupus Now." LFA works to increase public awareness and knowledge of lupus prevention, diagnosis, and treatment by distributing PSAs to radio and television stations, newspapers and magazines; producing and distributing video news releases; and disseminating education materials to the general public. The organization provides support and services to affiliates, support groups, and other interested partners to serve the needs of the lupus community. Some (\$245,648 or 5%) of LFA's program services are conducted in conjunction with its fundraising appeals.
